4. In one or two sentences, state what the writer is arguing about the risk decision at hand.

5. Make an outline of the paper.

6. List the kinds of evidence used to support the author's position. Which pieces of evidence do you think are the strongest? Which are the weakest?

7. After reading the whole paper, do you agree or disagree with the writer's position? Why or why not?
